Marilyn Barr was the Founder and Executive Director of the National Center on Shaken Baby Syndrome in the United States of America. She also was the Director of the British Columbia Shaken Baby Syndrome Prevention Program in Canada. Marilyn worked in the field of child abuse prevention for 30 years before retiring in 2015. She has a degree in Social Work; Criminal Justice and Communications.

She developed and co-founded the first national prevention program on SBS in the world. She has organized and directed over 15 National Conferences on Shaken Baby Syndrome and Child Abuse held in the United States, Canada and four other countries.

In her early career, she was also the Founder and Executive Director of the Child Abuse Prevention Center and Prevent Child Abuse Utah in the United States. She developed programs in the Court System; Care Centers; Public Schools and Community Based Programs.
